2. Cash incentives to limit farm production.
3. Tasked with creating industry-wide codes intended to eliminate harmful and unjust trade and labor practices.
4. Hydroelectric dams to control flooding and distribute electricity. Offered training and education classes to improve agricultural practices and take advantage of new job opportunities.
5. Grants-in-aid to local governments for large infrastructure projects, such as bridges, tunnels, schoolhouses, libraries, etc.
6. Young men employed on conservation and reforestation projects.
7. Designed to assist poor farmers during the Dust Bowl and the Great Depression. Most famous for a program documenting the lives of American farmers in a series of black-and-white photographs.
8. Direct cash assistance to state relief agencies.
